About the Program

This transfer program has been developed with the cooperation and support of Southern Oregon University (SOU). The degree is fully articulated with SOU's Hospitality and Tourism Management program and allows students to transfer directly as juniors and to become admitted into SOU's School of Business with no loss of credits to pursue a Bachelor of Science degree. The program offers an excellent balance of hospitality, business, and general education courses that support advanced study in the field of business.

Students should contact an advisor within the Hospitality and Tourism Management (HTM) department at CCC early in the first year of their transfer program to be advised about additional requirements and procedures for admission to the school or program. Students transferring to SOU will be required to complete BA100 Orientation to the School of Business and BA282 Business Statistics at SOU during their first quarter enrolled.

Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this degree, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU.

Entry Requirements

Students are required to take the Chemeketa Community College placement test to determine skill level and readiness as indicated by test scores. As part of their educational program, students must begin with the courses within their skill levels as determined by their scores. In addition, students may also be required to enroll in classes that would increase their employability and success.

Transfer Courses

Coursework from accredited colleges and universities will be accepted in accordance with college policies and the Hospitality & Tourism Management Director's approval. In order to ensure coursework is current, program courses over 10 years old must be reviewed and approved by the appropriate department head before being accepted toward course requirements.

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete a minimum of 90 quarter credits of lower division collegiate courses with a minimum grade of "C" or better.

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NOTE: Students who have graduated from high school or completed a high school equivalency program in 1997 or after must have the following requirement for admission to a four-year Oregon state college or university: 1) Two years of the same high school-level language, or 2) two terms of college-level language with a grade of "C" or better (may be first-year language which can be used as elective credits). Note: If students plan to complete a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree at a four-year school, they must have a proficiency in a foreign language regardless of when they graduated from high school or equivalency program.

NOTE: Business majors are required to complete a minor, a certificate program, or study abroad for one academic year as part of their bachelor degree requirements. Lower division classes for the minor can often be taken at CCC as part of the electives. Students are advised to speak with a School of Business faculty advisor about minor and certificate options by calling (541) 552-6484.

NOTE: Students should be aware that if they transfer before completing this transfer program, their courses will be evaluated individually toward the general education requirements in effect at SOU. Students who complete the transfer program in Hospitality and Tourism Management at CCC and major in HTM at SOU will not be required to take BA226 Business Law to be admitted to the School of Business. Students will also receive a waiver of BA312 Hospitality and Tourism Marketing; however, substitute upper division level credits in business must be taken as suggested and approved by the SOU HTM coordinator.
