Upon completing the AAOT with emphasis in Criminal Justice at LBCC, students who apply and are accepted to Southern Oregon University's Criminal Justice program will be granted junior status. Lower division Criminology & Criminal Justice (CCJ) prerequisites will be considered complete. Students enrolled in either the online degree completion program or registered in online CCJ courses must successfully complete CCJ 298 at SOU (Orientation to CCJ Online Courses).
