Areas of Recent Research Involvement

- 2003-2009: Using primary (surveys and ethnographic interviews) and secondary sources I am conducting research regarding preparation for graduate studies and attributes and skills for success in graduate school. Over 30 interviews with professors holding Ph.D.s have been completed, transcribed, and analyzed.
- 1993-2009: I am engaging in research related to the development of personal identity, cyber-culture, and creation of groups through the utilization of computer mediated communication and the Internet. This research also extends into the applications of computer mediated communication as applied to teaching.
- 2002-2009: Using primary and secondary sources, photography, and video documentation I am investigating Table Rocks near Medford, Oregon, focusing on its significance in the history and culture of the Native American residents of Southern Oregon.
- 1998-2009: Literary research and photographic exploration of Highway Route US-97 examining its history, development, cultures, and landscapes.
