*SEA CAMP of Oregon* was first established in 1996 with the goal of offering children a hands-on experience in marine biology and science.

Southern Oregon University Pre-College Youth Programs and the Oregon Institute of Marine Biology (OIMB) have worked together to create an environment where students can experience and explore the wonders of our oceans and coastlines.



## General Information

*SEA CAMP of Oregon*, for children ages 9-12, is a residential camp held at the Oregon coast in the town of Charleston just south of Coos Bay.

Students meet at Southern Oregon University where they board the *Sea Camp* vans and travel to the coast. They then spend the next three days hiking, observing marine animals, tide pooling and taking classes in marine biology.

## Activities

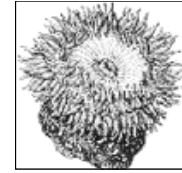


The *Sea Camp* curriculum is hands-on and includes classes and activities in marine biology, including:

- ◆ Crabbing
- ◆ Laboratory classes with sharks, bony fishes, mammals, birds and invertebrates
- ◆ Tide pooling at Sunset Bay
- ◆ Seal and sea lion viewing
- ◆ Birdwatching
- ◆ Marine biology videos and slides
- ◆ Visits to Shore Acres Botanical Gardens and Beach
- ◆ Beach campfire and games
- ◆ Clamming
- ◆ Hiking at South Slough Estuary

## Staff

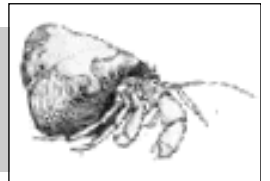
### Sea Camp Directors:
