Southern Oregon University Pre-College Youth Programs classes are open to all interested students. Preregistration accompanied by FULL payment is required for every class, and classes fill on a first-come basis.

Refund Policy. We will issue a refund if a student withdraws at least two working days prior to the first class.

Cancellations. In the event that a class does not receive sufficient registration to meet the enrollment minimum, the class may be cancelled. If a class is cancelled, we will notify registered students and issue a full refund or credit the cost of the class plus \$10 to the student's account.

Tuition Assistance. SOU Pre-College Youth Programs offers partial scholarships for eligible students. For a tuition assistance application, call 541-552-6452 or check the appropriate box on the registration form. Students may request tuition assistance for one class per term. Maximum tuition assistance is limited to one-third of the total course fee. The gross family income that qualifies students is based on Oregon's Income Eligibility Guidelines for Free and Reduced Lunch Program.

Class Size and Waiting Lists. Maximum enrollment for classes varies from ten to twenty-five students. If a class fills, we will establish a waiting list and notify students if space becomes available.

Confirmation. Confirmation is sent by email when the student is registered for a class. If you do not have an email account, we will mail you the confirmation. Directions to each class will be included with the confirmation.

High School Early Entry

The Early Entry program is a program for high school juniors and seniors who meet the qualifications to take courses at Southern Oregon University for college credit (at reduced tuition) and to help fulfill requirements for high school graduation.
