Adaptive functioning refers to the ability of a person to interact with the world and support oneself with or without supports

Individuals with ASD may have differential adaptive ability versus intellectual ability

An individual with ASD may be highly intelligent with poor adaptive functioning.

of individuals with autism have been the victim of a crime



ASD individuals may be vulnerable to abuse and manipulation (may be naïve, may mimic others without realizing any issues in doing so, may not be able to tell if an intimate partner is lying or manipulating them, etc.)



ASD individuals may be victimized due to behavior perceived as antisocial

ASD individuals benefit from instruction from individuals specialized in teaching ASD students



ASD requires specific instruction on expectations of sexual behavior (informal social "rules," as well as legal expectations) as well as the reasons why social rules exist in society



Repetition and review will assist in comprehension and internalizing of guidelines




